UNIFORM POLICY 2022 - 2023

Shirts	Navy blue polo with the Adams logo Spirit shirts: (clubs, sports, organizations) Permitted on Fridays ONLY
Pants	Khaki uniform pants that have an inside pocket. No low-rise, cargo, skinny pants, leggings, jeggings or jean look-alike (outside pockets) or any type of stretch pants will be allowed. Pants legs must not be cut, frayed, rolled or have an elastic cuff. Pants must be worn at the waist.
Skirts	Navy plaid skirts that touch the knee. Only solid, opaque tights may be worn underneath.
Shorts	Khaki uniform style shorts may be worn. Shorts must be properly fitted and knee length.
Belts	NOT REQUIRED
Socks	REQUIRED
Shoes	Only tennis shoes (any color) with shoe strings will be allowed.
Sweatshirts	Navy blue or gray sweatshirts with the Adams logo. Hooded and front pocket sweatshirts are prohibited and will be confiscated.
Jackets	Jackets must have the Adams logo. NO JEAN JACKETS. *Arrangements will be made for extreme temperatures.
Backpacks/ Purses	Backpacks must be clear or mesh (see-through). Purses must be the size of a sheet of paper or smaller.

THE FOLLOWING ARE NOT PERMITTED:

- Hooded garments, hats, or caps AT ANY TIME
- Facial piercings and large jewelry- (NO hooped earrings or earrings larger than the size of a quarter)
- Jean Jackets
- Holes in the clothing
- Hair rollers
- Clothing or accessories depicting any type of
 - off-campus fraternities, sororities, or any other group designs or insignia
 - alcohol, drug, or cigarette related items or symbols
 - unpatriotic words or pictures
 - violence, blood, knives, guns, etc.
 - suggestive words or pictures
- Bandanas/handkerchiefs/scarves worn on the body or as headwear
- Shirts worn over the uniform shirts. All outerwear must have the Adams logo.
- Flip flops, slip-on shoes, slippers, Crocs

Unapproved items will be confiscated and held until the designated return day.

NOTE: Inappropriate clothing is a dress code violation. Items can be prohibited if they are viewed as disruptive to the educational process and/or viewed as putting a student in danger.
