
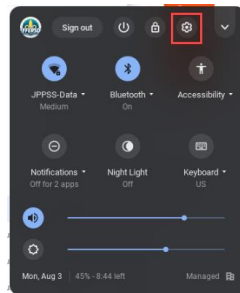
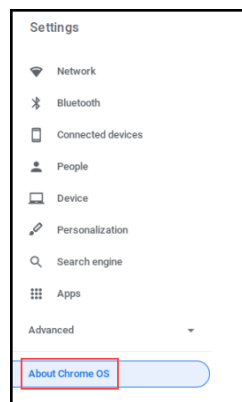


Manually Updating Chromebooks

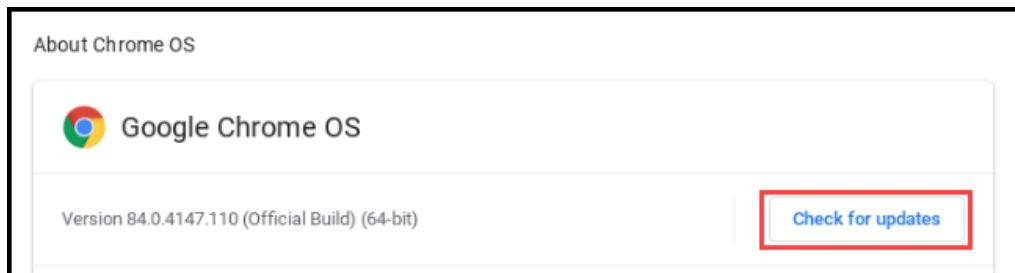
1. Turn on your Chromebook.
2. Connect your Chromebook to Wi-Fi.
3. At the bottom right, select the time.
4. Select **Settings** .



5. At the bottom of the left panel, select **About Chrome OS**.

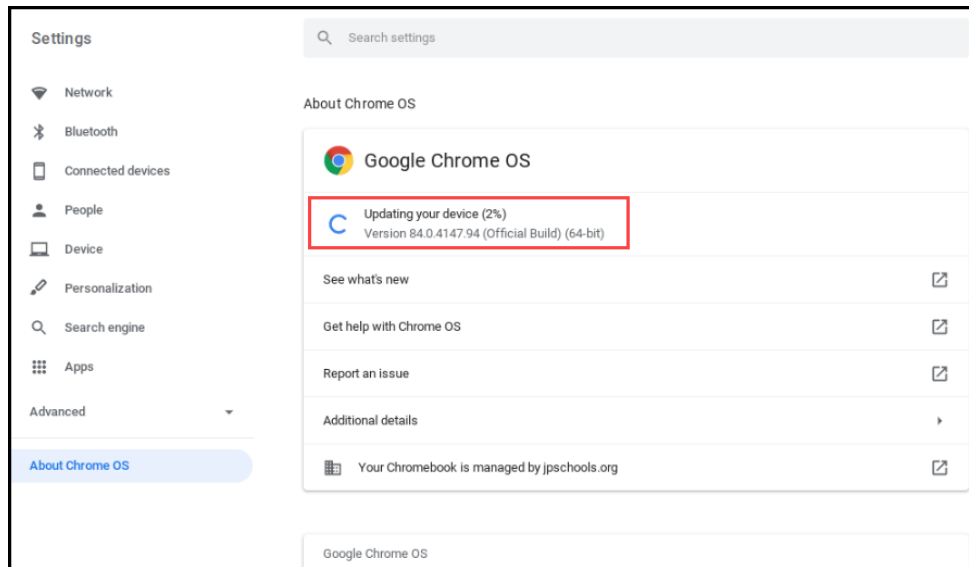


6. Under "**Google Chrome OS**," you will find which version of the Chrome operating system your Chromebook uses.

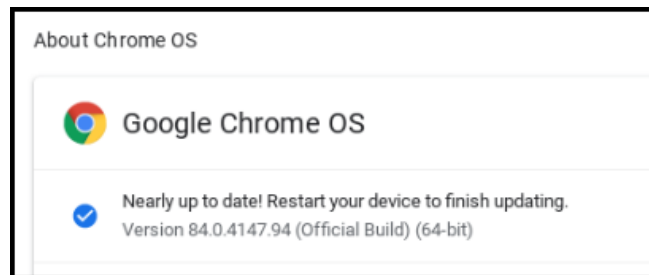


7. Click on the button labeled **Check for updates**.

8. If your Chromebook finds an available software update, it will start to download automatically.



9. When the Chromebook has finished updating, it will display a message similar to the one below and ask you to restart your device. Click on the **Restart** button to restart your device.



Note: If your Chromebook uses your phone's internet connection or its own mobile data, you will get an alert about how much mobile data it needs to update. You can then stop or continue with the update.

Fix problems with updates

If your system update will not download, try the steps below. Test your Chromebook after each step to see if the problem is fixed.

1. Turn off your Chromebook, and then turn it back on.
2. If you have trouble with your phone or Chromebook's mobile data to update your system, disconnect from the phone or mobile data. Connect to Wi-Fi or Ethernet instead.
