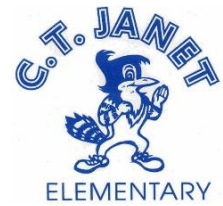

C.T. Janet will strive to be a school regarded for academic excellence and putting students first by:

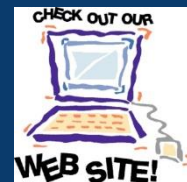
- preparing students to graduate on the appropriate academic path,

- continuously and holistically addressing all students' needs by maintaining a dedicated faculty and staff.

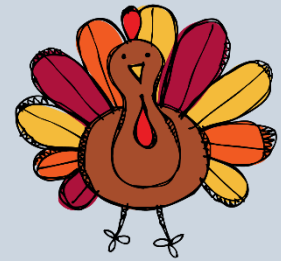

Carpool Reminders

- When you come to the second stop sign to turn onto Green Briar Dr., we will begin to split into two lines. **DO NOT SPLIT INTO TWO LINES UNTIL YOU PASS THE FIRST GATE.**
- **Once you pass the first gate**, one vehicle will go to the right, the next vehicle to the left, next vehicle to the right, next vehicle to the left. Continue in this manner until both sides of the street are filled.
- **DO NOT BLOCK THE FIRST GATE.** When you reach the last gate to enter the parking lot, you will merge back into one lane.
- If the **traffic backs up** on Bent Tree, please turn right and go through the neighborhood to keep the traffic moving.
 1. Right on Bent Tree 2. Left on Dylan
 3. Left on Allyson 4. Right on Beverly
 5. Left on Thornhedge 6. Left on Sprig
- If someone is coming into the carpool line from the neighborhood, **please be courteous** and allow them in the line. They do not have to go out of the neighborhood and come back in on Bent Tree.
- Parents **must** remain in the car. If you need to fasten your child in with a **seat belt**, please **pull all the way up past the cones** to stop and fasten the seat belt so the carpool line may continue to move
- Even if your child is at cone 3 and there are no cars at cones 1 and 2, **pull all the way** up to the first available cone. The students will move to you. This will allow for a faster flow of the carpool line.
- If your child's name is not displayed on a sign in your window, you will be asked to park. Your child will be called after the last car.
- If your child is in childcare, you must park and go in the cafeteria to sign your child out. Child care students **will not** be dismissed until carpool is complete.
- Be sure your child knows their mode of transportation whether it is a walker, carpool, bus, or childcare. If you choose to change the mode of transportation for your child, it must be submitted in writing to both angela.diamond@jpschools.org and sharona.comer@jpschools.org.
- **NO CELL PHONE** usage is allowed in the carpool line.



A Note From The School Nurse

How do I know when to keep my child home from school because of illness?

PARENTS SHOULD ALWAYS KEEP THEIR CHILD HOME PENDING A COVID TEST RESULT (SYMPTOMATIC OR ASYMPTOMATIC) AND NOTIFY SCHOOL ASAP OF RESULTS OR PENDING RESULTS TO STOP THE POSSIBLE SPREAD OF COVID VIRUS

Parents should keep their child home from school because of a serious illness, injury or a condition that can be passed on to other children. Although no comprehensive list is possible, the following conditions may be considered appropriate reasons to keep a student home from school:

OTHER Examples of serious illness or injury

- Vomiting
- Temperature 100.4 or greater (99.4 FOREHEAD THERMOMETER)
- Abdominal pain
- Ear ache
- Head injury
- Adverse medication effect
- Suspected fracture
- Chest pain
- Severe pain
- Severe shortness of breath or wheezing

Examples of possibly communicable or contagious conditions

- Vomiting
- Loose runny stools/diarrhea
- Suspected communicable disease
- Nuisance condition not currently being treated; e.g., ringworm, scabies, head lice
- Red, draining eyes
- Persistent runny nose with yellow/green discharge, accompanied by fever
- Productive cough, accompanied by fever
- Undiagnosed rash

Parents should consult with their doctor for advice and/or treatment of the conditions or symptoms listed here.
