School Time

Start of the day begins at 7:00 am. **No student will be admitted on school grounds until 7:00 am.** Breakfast is served until 7:20 am.

Tardiness to School

Any student arriving after the start of the school day, 7:20 am. will be considered tardy or late for school. **A parent/guardian must accompany the tardy student into the office to sign the tardy sheet.** A tardy slip will be issued admitting the student to class. **If an adult does not accompany the student, he/she will have to remain in behavior intervention until an adult sign them into school.** Note: Instructional minutes that are missed due to excessive tardiness counts toward absences. Students arriving to school after the tardy bell will be subject to progressive disciplinary action as follows:

1 st Offense	Warning/Parent Contacted
2 nd Offense	Parent Conference
3 rd Offense	Detention
4 th Offense	In School Suspension

Tardy to Class

All students must quickly transition to class. Tardy sweeps take place periodically. Students who arrive late to class must be marked tardy by the classroom teachers and will not be allowed to obtain a pass from anywhere, including the office. Only the office will issue a pass to those students who have been detained by an administrator. Students arriving after the tardy bell will be subject to progressive action as follows:

Absentecism

Students are encouraged to attend school daily. Excessive absences will affect your child's grades. Students are responsible for all missed work and returning any documentation to the front office to excuse absences. Students can only miss up to 14 days a school year. Make certain your child doesn't fail because of absences.

Policy and Procedures

Dress Code Policy

- 6th Graders: Gray Livaudais polo shirt, khaki pants, belt, and athletic shoes.
- 7th Graders: Navy blue Livaudais polo shirt, khaki pants, belt, and athletic shoes.
- 8th Graders: Powder blue Livaudais polo shirt, khaki pants, belt, and athletic shoes.
- (Cargo, cell phone pockets or joggers are NOT Allowed.)**
- Shirts must be tucked in at all times.
- Students can wear any color athletic shoes. **Boots, heels, Crocs, sandals, boat shoes, or baby doll shoes are NOT ALLOWED.**
- Backpacks, large purses or athletic bags are not NOT ALLOWED.**
- Only Livaudais sweatshirts may be worn!
- Hoodies (Pullover or Zip Up) are NOT ALLOWED. They will be confiscated.**

- Hats, shower caps, durags, or bandanas are NOT ALLOWED.
- Girls can only wear stud earrings.

Students who have sweatshirts/hoodies confiscated in the morning will be able to retrieve their items on Friday afternoon.

Livaudais WILL NOT be responsible for any of these items being stolen or damaged. Any sweatshirts/hoodies not picked up on Fridays will be donated to Goodwill.

Cell Phone Policy

Cell Phone and Earbud usage are prohibited on campus. If these items are visible or audible they will be confiscated.

- During the instructional day, cell phones must remain out of sight and in silent mode.
- If students need to place an emergency phone call during the day, they should request to go the front office to use an office phone.
- Students will receive a disciplinary action (IN School Suspension/Out of School Suspension) if their cell phone disrupts the school's educational environment. Examples of this include, but are not limited to: cheating, bullying, harassment, unlawful recording or photographing and violating other school rules.
- The school and its staff are not responsible for any damage to or theft of a student's cell phone. Students must properly secure and take care of their own phones.
- The administration reserves the right to adjust these consequences on a case-by-case basis if needed. For example, extreme behaviors that break the law or engaging in bullying or harassment of other students may result in suspension.

Consequences for Misuse

- First Offense:**
Warning/Parent Conference: The student's cell phone will be confiscated by a staff member and held in the main office until the end of the school day. A faculty member will contact the student's parent and review the school's cell phone policy with student and parent.
- Second Offense:**
The student's cell phone will be confiscated by a staff member and held in the main office until a parent picks up the cell phone between 2:00 pm and 2:40 pm of that day. This is the only time cell phones can be picked up! Student will also receive a **detention.**
- Third Offense:**
The student's cell phone will be confiscated by a staff member and held in the main office until a parent picks up the cell phone between 2:00 pm and 2:40 pm of that day. This is the only time cell phones can be picked up! Student will also receive an **In School Suspension.**
- Fourth Offense:**
The student's cell phone will be confiscated by a staff member and held in the main office until a parent picks up the cell phone between 2:00 pm and 2:40 pm of that day. This is the only time cell phones can be picked up! Student will also receive an **Out of School Suspension.**

Fighting/Multiple Referrals

All individuals who participate in fighting must attend the Violence Prevention Saturday Class at West Jefferson High School. The cost of the class is 75.00. Students will not be allowed to participate in any extracurricular activities until they attend the class.

Bullying

Livaudais has a zero-tolerance policy for bullying. Any student who chooses to participate in bullying will be suspended, and must attend the Violence Prevention Saturday Class at West Jefferson High School. **The cost of the class is \$75.00**
