A Message from the School Principal Continued:

As we enter the second half of the school year, I want to take this time to revisit a few housekeeping items. I am noticing more students are tardy on a daily basis. Please make sure all students arrive at school on time and ready to learn. Students must be in their homeroom classrooms by 7:45. Carpool families should be in the carpool line prior to 7:35. When our students are rushing from the car to their class they may get frustrated or upset. We want to ensure a positive start to the school day. Please help us with this. Students with excessive absences or tardies will need to meet with a member of our administration.

Parents are doing a great job at dismissal. Please make sure you have your sign, with your child's name, if you are picking up in the car rider line. Parents are reminded that they are not allowed to park at Rouses and walk to pick up their children. This is for the safety of our families. Parents of students who walk home are encouraged to speak to them about walking straight home and not cutting through the St. Philip parking lot. We encourage parents to meet their children and walk home with them as often as possible. Some of our students are gathering near the church or in other areas and getting in trouble after school. Please help us by talking to your children about their safety after school.

Technology:

All K - 8th grade students have been issued a district chromebook to use at school. These chromebooks are used for daily instruction, assignments and projects. All Pre-K students have been issued an iPad. It is important that we have a signed permission slip on file for ALL students. It isn't just for those taking the device home.

The agreement states that you are giving permission for a child to use the device and agree to the district's acceptable use of electronic equipment. If you need a new form- please contact your child's teacher.

Devices MUST come to school completely charged each day. Chargers should travel with the device.



Instructional Programs


All Bissonet students have access to Clever. Clever is a single sign on website that allows students access to different educational apps and websites that are used at school. Students have access to: iReady, Lexia- Core 5, BrainPop & BrainPop Jr., Nearpod, Edulastic, Zearn, LearnZillion, CKLA Hub, Stemscopes, WorldBook Online, Destiny (Library Catalog), and so much more!

During the school year, we encourage ALL students to work on iReady ,Lexia and/or ZEARN for a total of 45 min. per subject each week. Grades K-2: ZEARN Math and Lexia Reading. Grades 3-5: iReady Math and Reading and Grades 6-8 ZEARN only. If you have any login issues, please contact: christine.dauterive@jpschools.org.

Why are we sharing this? It is important for our parents to be familiar with this resource. We ask that parents assist their students with their learning at home by making sure they know how to login to the platform and access the programs the teacher assigns. In addition, we ask that students complete additional time on the iReady and Lexia programs- not just the time spent on the programs in the class. Zearn is a valuable Math resource, as it is aligned to the Math curriculum used in the classroom. If your child is struggling in Math- please talk to them about logging in to Zearn.

PRE-K NEWS:

HAPPY NEW YEAR!!!

Thank you to all parents for making this a great year so far!! Stay tuned for several events that are coming up soon... Check folders daily for homework, notes from the office etc. Remember to send a change of clothes if your child has an accident and label all sweaters and jackets.

Our students are collecting "B-Bucs" during the school day for positive behavior reinforcement. They are responsible for collecting these Bucs during the school day and can shop for special items on the days when the Buc-E cart visits our classroom!! Remember to Focus, use Helping Hands and Eagle Eyes to earn your Bucs each day!!!

We will continue to study letters, sounds, syllables, rhyming words, numbers, patterns and counting. Please complete and review all homework assignments each day!!

1st Grade:

At this point of the year, the students should be reading their readers and writing sentences independently. Learning the weekly Tricky Words are very important for your child in order to read and write on level. Here are some activities to practice the spelling and tricky words at home:

- -Write your words on index cards- Shuffle the stack of words and ask your child to read the words five times in a row.
- -Go Fish Use index cards. Write each word on two cards.
- Word Searches Find sight words on food boxes or other available print material, such as magazines.
- -Concentration Use index cards. Write each word on two cards, shuffle and lay face down to play.
- -Letter Magnets Call out a sight word and ask your child to use the magnets to spell the word. -Sentence Building As your child's baggie begins to fill up with words, ask him/her to use as many words in a sentence as possible.

First graders should also be fluent with addition and subtraction facts within 12. Writing basic facts on index cards is a great way to practice and increase fluency. Students have been learning about measurement and will soon be learning about place value. Please continue to practice the lesson taught in class each day by completing the coordinating lesson homework.

SECOND GRADE:

We hope you all had an amazing break and are ready to start the new year!

ELA

We are starting our new domain on Westward Expansion. This domain will introduce students to an important period in the history of the United States. Students will learn why pioneers were willing and eager to endure hardships to move westward. More specifically, students will learn about Fulton's Steamboat, the Erie Canal, the transcontinental railroad, and the Pony Express. Students will come to understand the hardships and tragedies that Native Americans endured because of the Westward expansion.

Math

We will continue working in Module 5 where students will practice the simplifying strategies they learned in Module 4 but with numbers up to 1,000. Throughout Module 5, students maintain addition and subtraction fluency within 100 as they use these skills during their application work to solve word problems of all types. Topic A will focus on place value strategies to add and subtract within 1,000. Students relate 100 more and 100 less to addition and subtraction of 100. The topic ends with students sharing and critiquing solution strategies for addition and subtraction problems.




THIRD GRADE:

Happy New Year! We are excited to start the second half of third grade! Check with your child to see what school supplies that may need to be replenished. Students MUST have a pair of headphones to use in class every day. Also check your child's folder and planner to see important notes and homework assignments.

In MATH, we are starting a new module with a new homework book! Please leave the old book at home. You may use it for practice. The homework book should say "Modules 5-7" on the front. Students should be working on ZEARN at school and home. The goal is 2-3 lessons per week, but it will be beneficial to work on it every day in order to keep up with the material taught at school. We have started a unit on fractions, but we will continue to review multiplication and division as we prepare for the LEAP test later this year.







ELA/SS



4th Grade

Welcome back and Happy New Year!!! We hope that our students had a wonderful holiday break!

A few reminders.... Students must have headphones at school for daily use; pencil pouches should be filled and replenished with supplies needed daily (sharpened pencils, scissors, glue sticks, crayons, dry erase markers, et.); check your child's red folder daily as well as the Google classrooms for important reminders and information.

Math

We are wrapping up Module 4 on Geometry and will soon be starting Module 5 on Fractions. Practicing math skills every day, completing homework and Zearn lessons are beneficial to a student's success. At least 2-3 Zearn lessons per week is the goal.

Science

We have just started our new bundle on Energy Transformations. The kids are already excited about making circuits to light bulbs and make buzzer sounds! We will also be exploring energy in movement, speed, and collisions. These in class activities are fun and engaging so be sure your child is at school to join in!!

Happy New Year!! I'm looking forward to an amazing semester with your children.. It's hard to believe that we are halfway through the 22-23 school year. We still have so much to accomplish together. Let's all work together to make the remainder of the year successful. In the end, each of us should be able to say, "I did my best!"

In 6th grade we will wrap up Module 1 soon. The students have had the opportunity to solve lots of real world problems. The students have been working on comparing shopping prices by finding the unit price of items. Analyzing data in tables, graphs, words, and equations have helped them decide how to make smarter purchasing decisions. Next, we will explore percentages.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION CLASS INFORMATION:


As colder weather approaches, please make sure your student is dressed in the proper outerwear for outside PE class.
