Technology:

All K - 8th grade students have been issued a district chromebook to use at school. These chromebooks are used for daily instruction, assignments and projects. All Pre-K students have been issued an iPad. It is important that we have a signed permission slip on file for ALL students. It isn't just for those taking the device home. The agreement states that you are giving permission for a child to use the device and agree to the district's acceptable use of electronic equipment. If you need a new form- please contact your child's teacher.

Devices MUST come to school completely charged each day. Chargers should travel with the device.

Instructional Programs

All Bissonet students have access to Clever. Clever is a single sign on website that allows students access to different educational apps and websites that are used at school. Students have access to: iReady, Lexia- Core 5, BrainPop & BrainPop Jr., Nearpod, Edulastic, Zearn, LearnZillion, CKLA Hub, Stemscopes, WorldBook Online, Destiny (Library Catalog), and so much more!

During the school year, we encourage ALL students to work on iReady ,Lexia and/or ZEARN for a total of 45 min. per subject each week. Grades K-2: ZEARN Math and Lexia Reading. Grades 3-5: iReady Math and Reading and Grades 6-8 ZEARN only. If you have any login issues, please contact: christine.dauterive@jpschools.org.

Why are we sharing this? It is important for our parents to be familiar with this resource. We ask that parents assist their students with their learning at home by making sure they know how to login to the platform and access the programs the teacher assigns. In addition, we ask that students complete additional time on the iReady and Lexia programs- not just the time spent on the programs in the class. Zearn is a valuable Math resource, as it is aligned to the Math curriculum used in the classroom. If your child is struggling in Math- please talk to them about logging in to Zearn.

PRE-K NEWS:


Thanks to all parents who made our Pumpkin Patch trip a huge success!! The kids had a great time on the nature hike, picnic and picking pumpkins.

1st Grade:

Dear Parents,

The ability to recall number facts instantly is called fact power. Instant recall is indeed a powerful tool, for it facilitates computation with multidigit numbers. Fact power is also essential in solving multistep problems. We call 0-facts, 1-facts, and doubles the "easy" addition facts and there are 44 of them in all. Most children have no problem with instant recall of these facts. This leaves 56 remaining facts. Because these 56 facts include all of the turn-around facts, like 2 + 3 = 5 and 3 + 2 = 5, there are really only 28 other facts that children need to learn. I have listed these 28 facts below in hopes that you will assist your child as much as possible in having an instant recall of these facts. Your child has been taught strategies for remembering most of these facts, such as the plus-9 shortcut and the doubles-plus-1 and doubles-plus-2 strategies. Frequent oral drills give children a chance to practice with the facts, so please do so as much as you can.

ELA

We are finishing up our domain on Greek Myths next week. We are excited to start our new Domain on the War of 1812. This domain will introduce students to an important period of history in the United States. The War of 1812 is, perhaps, best remembered as the war that gave birth to "The Star-Spangled Banner." Students will learn why the War of 1812 is often called America's second war of independence.

Math

This week, we began Module 4.. Students will build their understanding of the base ten system and their prior knowledge of place value strategies presented in Module 3. Students will apply place value understanding to add and subtract multiples of 10 before counting on by tens.

ELA/SS



In ELA, we have been reading literary and informational texts about hurricanes. Right now we are reading "I Survived Hurricane Katrina." Some of the reading and writing skills we've learned about are describing characters, setting, and events, note-taking, types of sentences, expanding sentences, and single paragraph outlines. We will apply the writing skills and techniques we've learned to write our very first essay about hurricanes, so be on the lookout for our amazing compositions.

In social studies, we are busy learning about events leading up to the American Revolutionary War. If you ask us, we should be able to tell you all about the French and Indian War, The Stamp Act, The Townshends Acts, The Boston Massacre, The Tea Act, and The Boston Tea Party. We will finish up our unit learning about the development of the U.S. government.

We are also excited about using and learning different technology tools. Some of the tools we've used in ELA and social studies are Kami, Google Slides, Google Documents, and Google Forms. We will continue to learn and use more technology tools as the school year progresses.



5TH GRADE

We're excited to go on our first **field trip the week of November 7th to Starbase Camp** located at Jackson Barracks! Students had such a great time last year learning about robotics and aerospace! This is such a great STEM experience! **November 8th we will be off of school!**

ELA- Students are finishing up their novel, The Birchbark House. Our unit goal is why should we learn from the stories of the past? As we progress through the novel, students are understanding the relationship between Native Americans and nature and the impact European colonization had on that. As a result, students will answer our unit goal question. We will write a literary analysis about the novel at the end of the unit.

Social Studies- We have begun Unit 2, Topic 1(B) about the Columbian Exchange. Students will consider how the Columbian Exchange changed the culture and/or economy of North America, Europe, and Africa. They will be assessed with a writing prompt and multiple select assessment.

If students are absent, they should be reading their novel to catch up with the class.

MIDDLE SCHOOL:

6th and 7A Math - Wellmeier


All students should be completing Zearn lessons at home. Please check your child's red communication folder and Google Classroom for important letters and assignments.

The 6th graders are getting started on Module 1 Ratios and Unit Rates. In this module students will explore ratios and percentages in real life situations.

In 7th grade, the students will wrap up Module 1 and move to Module 4 Percent and Proportional Relationships. Students will explore real life situations including distances, measurements, and percentages.

MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS:

Middle School Science:


Sixth grade students are currently studying "Potential Energy" and will begin their last physical science bundle, "Waves and their Applications," before the Thanksgiving break. Seventh grade students have completed studying the "Water Cycle" and will begin their next scope, "Predicting Weather," on 2 November 2022. Eighth grade students have completed "Geologic History of Earth" and will begin their next scope, "Plate Tectonics," also on 2 November 2022. Our sixth grade students will complete their study of physical science before the end of the calendar year while our seventh grade students will complete their earth science scopes around 9 January 2023. Eighth grade students will complete studying their first earth science bundle and start their second earth science bundle before the end of this calendar year.

If it is within your child's control, I ask that they <u>come prepared with charged Chromebooks</u>, especially if they are in the sixth grade. My classroom is a little crowded with limited space and electrical outlets for students to use their chargers. Also, students should spend at least 15 minutes daily reviewing their picture vocabulary and concept review game in STEMscopes to thoroughly understand the key terms and concepts to be learned for the particular scope they are studying.
